




Exporting citations 'how to' guide

Exporting citations

This guide illustrates how to save citations for future reference and create bibliographies.

Select the records you would like to save. You can also print or email records if you prefer.

Select *Save*.

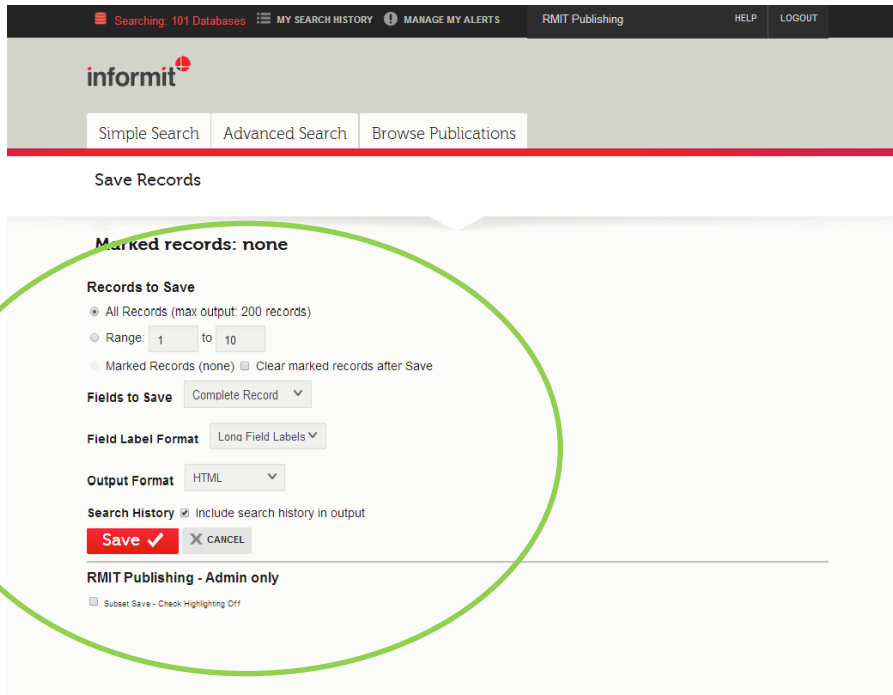

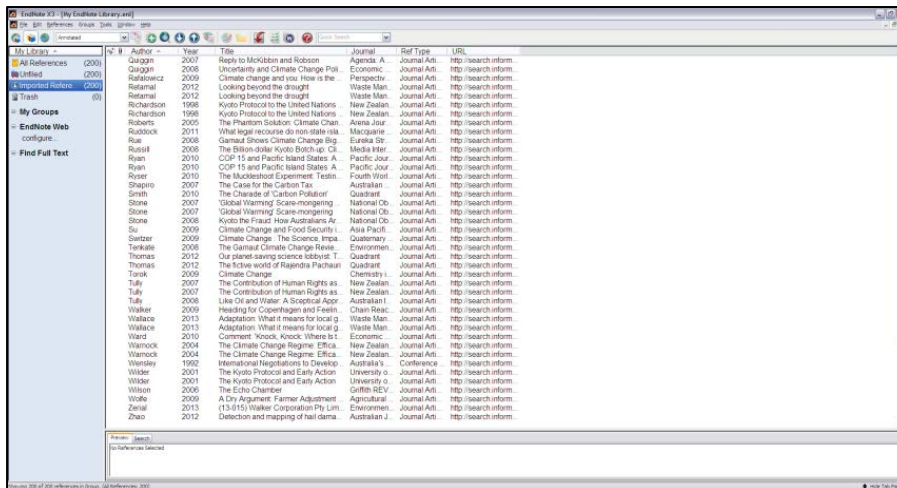
Select your preferred options.
