Curatorial Statement



The History Channel and National Geographic are recorded 24/7 and stored for 14 days. Other pay television broadcasts of films, documentaries and series are recorded and added according to our weekly schedule.

EduTV is a service available to higher education institutions that hold a Screenrights licence enabling them to copy and communicate television and radio broadcasts for educational purposes.

Programming schedule

We add around 80 programs per week to EduTV from both free-to-air and pay television broadcasts in Australia. A weekly schedule of the programs to be recorded and added can be accessed via the EduTV platform.

Recording and storage

We record all free-to-air broadcasts 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Programs that are not included in our weekly schedule are stored for 28 days pending requests for inclusion on EduTV.

Program requests

EduTV customers may nominate titles for inclusion. If the program has been recorded and stored, we will post the program immediately. If we have not recorded the program, we will place it on a list to be recorded and posted to EduTV when it is re-broadcast.

When making a program request, please include the educational value the program will offer – i.e. course name, project description, etc. Prior to submitting your request, please check the EduTV Program Guide which is accessible via the EduTV platform.

We endeavour to capture all programs requested, subject to our capacity limitations.

Persistence

When programs that were originally broadcast without closed captions are re-broadcast with closed captions, EduTV will replace the original version with the version including the captions. The intent is to make EduTV accessible to the hearing impaired.

Please note, any links to the original program will lose functionality. This can result in a loss of content from favourites, clips and projects.

Impartiality

EduTV aims to ensure a fair balance of opinion in order to present educators with an impartial view of issues or topics.
